March 23 to 24, sundown to sundown, marks the Jewish holiday of Purim. The story of Purim from the Bible

involves another Mordechai who, long ago, obtained information that the Jews of Persia were going to be killed. Through the courage of Esther, this massacre was prevented. Now current-day Lee Mordechai is warning all of us about the ongoing massacre of Palestinian people in Gaza. Can we all have courage like Esther and **do all we can** to prevent the killing?

ACTIONS: While the war goes on, insufficient aid is arriving in Gaza. PEOPLE, INCLUDING CHILDREN, ARE STARVING. The United States has stopped its funding of The United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA) which has been a major supplier of food.

- ACTION 1: Sign a MoveOn petition to Congress to restore UNRWA funding at https://sign.moveon.org/petitions/reinstate-unrwa-funding-so-they-can-resume-urgent-humanitarian-aid [Late edit: US Congress has passed, and Pres. Biden signed 3/23/24 a ban on UNRWA funding until 2025. What Congress passes, Congress can reverse. We suggest taking this action anyway. Two more actions below are now even more important.]
- ACTION 2: While a war is ongoing, it is incredibly dangerous and difficult for aid workers to provide food. Send your 3

24/7 ENCAMPMENT AT IMMIGRANT PRISON

Ongoing, at Northwest Detention Center, 1623 East J Street, Tacoma 98421, see volunteer participation instructions below

Protest ICE's human rights abuses. Although the United Nations Special Rapporteur on Torture and many human rights groups consider solitary confinement for longer than 15 days (or even shorter for certain vulnerable people) to be torture, Immigration and Customs

Enforcement (ICE) and its subcontractors hold immigrant prisoners in solitary for years.

At the Northwest Detention Center (NWDC), the death of Charles Leo Daniel in years-long solitary confinement has ignited a call to action. La Resistencia leader Maru Mora Villalpando and Tsuru for Solidarity Founder Michael Ishii, alongside 3 Tsuru for Solidarity members, are engaging in a fast to support the 300+ individuals on hunger strike inside the facility, protesting the inhumane conditions. The community has rallied with a 24/7 encampment, demanding an investigation into the tragic events at NWDC.

PEACE PILGRIMAGE PHILADELPHIA TO WEAPONS MAKER LOCKHEED

Through Fri March 29 (Good Friday), started at the Liberty Bell, Philadelphia, PA, on the way to Lockheed Martin headquarters in King of Prussia, PA

As Mary wept over Christ's body, this Lenten season we are all mothers in Gaza weeping over deceased children — over 10,000 killed since October 7, 2023 — senselessly from our bombs, bullets and indifference. Like the people of Gaza today, Jesus was born as a refugee, in the middle of a genocide in an occupied land. This Good Friday, we will demonstrate with our bodies and prayers the urgent cry for a ceasefire. As Christ said: "Blessed are the peacemakers for they are the children of God." Not in our name, not in the name of our Savior Christ, the Prince of Peace!

Between March 24 and March 29, intentionally planned to take place on Good Friday, when Christians around the world remember the crucifixion of Jesus, the Philadelphia Peace Pilgrims will walk 20 miles (almost the length of Gaza), pausing on the way to observe the 'Stations of the Cross,' representing different moments in Jesus' Passion and Death, to Lockheed Martin, the world's largest weapons contractor, complicit in decades of bombings in Gaza, including the current war, and violence and death around the world.

At Lockheed Martin, Philadelphia-based and national theologians and activists, including Shane Claiborne, Lisa Sharon Harper, Ariel Gold, Linda Sarsour, Rev. Mark Thompson, and others will -- armed with the spirit of Jesus and an unflinching commitment to nonviolence -- pray with a focus on the attempt to shut down or delay Lockheed Martin's

production of weapons, and to send a message urging the Biden Administration to stop sending weapons to Israel.

Land Day symbolizes the Palestinian peoples' unrelenting commitment to their lands and homes. 48 years ago, on March 30, 1976, Palestinians across occupied 1948 lands organized against Zionist attempts to seize more Palestinian lands. The events of Land Day included popular resistance, strikes, and confrontation with Zionist occupation forces that spread from colonized 1948 lands to the entirety of Palestine and throughout the diaspora in exile. The relationship between Palestinian people and their land remains unshaken. TRASH: A POOR WHITE JOURNEY BOOK LAUNCH EVENT WITH PANEL READING, Q&A, SIGNING

Sat March 30, 4 pm, at Orca Books, 315 5th Ave SE, Olympia

Book launch for "Trash: A Poor White Journey" by Cedar Monroe, with foreword by Liz Theoharis, Co-Chair of the Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival. The author, Cedar Monroe, has been involved with the Poor People's Campaign since its (re)launch in 2018 and has a compelling story to educate us on the realities of the lives of desperate poor people in the Aberdeen area as well as providing a cogent analysis of the underlying causes.

Monroe introduces us to people who are poor and unhoused in a small town in Washington, who eke out a living on land that once provided timber for the nation. On the banks of the Chehalis River, we meet residents of the largest homeless encampment in the county, who face sweeps and evictions and are targeted by vigilantes before bringing their case to federal court. We watch a community grapple with desperation, government neglect, and its own racism. From visits to jails, flophouses, tent cities, and on trips to hospitals and funeral

homes, we see leaders forging connections between their people and the global movement to end poverty.

With trenchant insight born of liberation theology, radical politics, and an even more radical hope, Monroe introduces us to people hammering out survival strategies and hope in the abandoned zones of empire. Capitalism and colonialism have stolen land from Indigenous people, forced workers into dangerous jobs, and then left them to die when their labor was no longer needed. But what would happen if poor white folks rejected the empty promises of white supremacy and embraced solidarity with other poor people? What if they joined the resistance to the system that is, slowly or quickly, killing us all? Trash asks us to see anew the peril in which poor white people live and the choices we all must make.

BOLDT DECISION AT 50 SYMPOSIUM
COURT AFFIRMS NATIVE AMERICAN TREATY RIGHTS

Sat March 30, 10 am – 5 pm, at Washington State History Museum, 1911 Pacific Avenue, Tacoma, WA 98402

Symposium in conjunction with museum exhibit.

On February 12, 1974, US District Court Judge George Boldt rendered what some consider one of the most significant court decisions issued during the twentieth century involving Native rights. To commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the Boldt Decision, Washington State

Historical Society is hosting a symposium exploring the history of this ruling that served as an affirmation of Tribal fishing rights and sovereignty. Guests will also have the rare opportunity to view the 1854 Treaty of Medicine Creek.

10-11 am: Intergenerational programming exploring traditional salmon stories and the role of fishing for Puget Sound Tribes facilitated by the Billy Frank Jr. National Wildlife Refuge.

noon to 1:30 pm: Luncheon sold out, and lecture viewing in overflow auditorium, featuring state historian John Hughes, which will provide an overview of the Boldt Decision itself and situate the role of Judge George H. Boldt within this broader historical context. Boxed lunches are available to purchase as part of the registration process.

2-3:30 PM: Panel conversation exploring the Boldt Decision and its legacies for Tribal communities. Moderated by Dr. Laurie Arnold of Gonzaga University, this panel conversation will include representatives from the Nisqually Tribe, the Puyallup Tribe of Indians, the Squaxin Island Tribe, and the Steilacoom Tribe who will discuss the range of ways that Boldt impacted Tribal life, both positive and negative.

3:30-5 pm: Informal book signing will allow program participants to connect with panelists and purchase copies of relevant historical scholarship.

With "wry humor and a meditative pace," the film depicts the dramas around the Palestinian custom of foraging for wild edible plants, and the impact of Israeli nature protection laws on these customs. The film's director, Jumana Manna, is a Palestinian visual artist and filmmaker whose "work explores how power is articulated, focusing on the body, land and materiality in relation to colonial inheritances and histories of place."

The 64-minute documentary will be followed by a post-film presentation and Q&A with Savvina Chowdhury, Political Economy and Environmental Justice Professor at The Evergreen State College, and by Peter Bohmer, representing the recently formed Palestine Action of South Sound (PASS).

We are delighted to announce that peace activist and pacifist Kathy Kelly will be our keynote speaker. Kathy has been nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize three times. She cofounded Voices in the Wilderness, which had a major educational and advocacy role in opposing the deadly US sanctions against Iraq. Later she continued her anti-war work with Voices for Creative Nonviolence. She has spent time in war zones and refugee settlements documenting the effects of wars in Nicaragua, Haiti, Bosnia, Iraq, Afghanistan, Gaza, and Pakistan. Kathy has been imprisoned for refusing to pay war taxes, fined for illegal acts of compassion in Iraq, and is now protesting the US-funded war against Palestinian people.

Kathy has also protested the US use of killer drones, training of human rights abusers at the School of the Americas, and US use of torture at Guantanamo.
